<b>SCHOOLING – WHO MAY RIDE?</b>	For the 3 days prior to the competition until the end of the event, only the competitor may school his horse. Mounted grooms may ride, exercise, work in hand and lunge a horse; they may walk and trot a horse from one place to another (Art 515 2.2.)
